Abstract	CMS.125 contains a collection of research notes, rare books, periodicals, and unpublished typescripts published from the mid nineteenth to the early twenty-first centuries, gathered by the late Roald Kverndal in the course of his research into the history of the pastoral care of mariners and fishing communities throughout history, across Christian denominations, and around the world.

Biographical/Historical note

Roald Kverndal was born to Olav and Valli Kverndal, both Norwegian immigrants, in Bromley, England, on July 8, 1921. He received his education in England but with close ties to Norway; he fought in the Norwegian Free Forces in World War II. After the war, he experienced a calling to church work and embarked on theological studies and studies in marine law, intending to provide pastoral care to mariners.

The Kverndal family had belonged to the Norwegian Seamen's Church in London, and there Roald met Ruth Louise Ursin, daughter of the church's pastor Johnny and his wife Emma. Roald and Ruth married June 27, 1953. The couple had four children, a son, Olaf, who predeceased his father, and three girls: Evelyn, Jeannette, and Marianne.

In 1954, Roald was ordained in the Lutheran church in Norway, and served as a chaplain of the Norwegian Seamen's Mission in Australia, France, and the United States, and later served his flock indirectly at the organization's headquarters in Norway. In 1972, he began to work with American Lutheran congregations, in New York, Chicago, and Seattle. Throughout his career, he researched the historical origins of the ministry to mariners worldwide, obtaining a doctor of philosophy from Oslo University in 1984. The doctorate allowed him to expand into consulting work for the Lutheran World Federation, and into the 1990s he followed the Gospel mandate of going out to all the world, preaching the necessity of the maritime ministry, studying its techniques, and expanding its reach to Asia and Africa. He completed a trilogy of books on the subject in 2012, before his death on Mercer Island, Washington, March 1, 2015.

Scope and Contents note

CMS.125 represents the scholarly passion of the Reverend Dr. Roald Kverndal to preserve the history of the pastoral care of seafarers and to use that history to continue that ministry. Kverndal began collecting material on the subject in the 1950s and continued into the 2000s, depositing the collection at the Center for Migration Studies in 2004, when he had finished researching his last books.

Kverndal's research notes took three forms. He had files, labeled by subject, containing photocopies of material he had seen during far-flung research trips. Those files make up the first Series in this collection. He also collected periodicals and he systematically photocopied material pertaining to the pastoral care of seafarers from runs of small-circulation periodicals. Those photocopies and runs of periodicals make up the second Series in this collection. Finally, Mr. Kverndal collected books. All the publications in his collection covered the history of the pastoral care of seafarers in some way. The publications were often privately published or came off small presses, and were distributed to limited audiences, such as donors

attending a fundraising event. While most can be found elsewhere, maintaining them in the third Series of this collection seemed most convenient for future researchers.

While some of the historical research reaches far into the past, the collection is strongest on the period from the eighteenth to the twentieth centuries. Individual items cover many different parts of the world; the collection as a whole is strongest on the English-speaking world and on the distinct legal world created by the law of the sea. The collection defines "seafarers" broadly. Publications are devoted to the care of naval officers and crew, members of the merchant marine, and fishing communities, both workers at sea and settlements on shore. The collection also defines "pastoral care" broadly. Some publications explain how to reach out and evangelize seafarers; these publications often explore the biblical use of maritime imagery and the practical issues of fostering individual and communal spiritual life aboard ship. Other publications cover maintaining the spiritual lives of seafarers, or ensuring social justice for them. The publications represent many denominations within Christianity and also the effort to find common ground among different forms of the faith; Kverndal himself contributed to the theology on which ecumenical cooperation in the maritime ministry could advance. Many publications recount the histories of agencies that provided spiritual and charitable assistance to active-duty seafarers and to those who could no longer work.

The Roald Kverndal Papers touch upon many subjects. Books that cover the charitable needs of retired sailors usually shed light on the population from which the sailors came, the work they did, the dangers that led to disability and retirement, and the problems of compensation that led to old age in a charitable institution. Books that cover the care of sailors over time also cover changes in the economics, technology, and legal framework of the maritime ministry. The collection is most significant for its focus on the particular community of people whose lives were defined by their work on water.

Processing Information note

Roald Kverndal deposited this collection at the Center for Migration Studies at its home at 209 Flagg Place, Staten Island, New York 10304 about 2004. Shortly thereafter, CMS moved from Staten Island to Manhattan, first to 27 Carmine Street, New York, New York 10014, and then to 307 East 60th Street, New York, New York 10022. In 2012, in preparation for these moves, CMS employee Mary Brown transferred the collection from the original boxes to document boxes. In the summer of 2019 Mary Brown and volunteer Mary T. Sanders unpacked the document boxes, arranged the collection into the present Series, housed files in archival folders, re-used the archival boxes for the collection, labeled the boxes, and prepared the finding aid. Regarding the books, they checked this collection against World Cat, which aggregates catalogs from libraries throughout the English-speaking world. Most of these publications are available in at least one other place, but most are available in only a few other places, and most are in widely scattered libraries.
